

January 25, 2011 is the date set for Haven of Hope's annual meeting, from 7 - 8 PM at the




church. Everyone interested is invited to attend.

When we think of those in poverty, certain questions automatically come to mind. Why don't they just get a job?! Why are they so irresponsible?! Are handouts really all they want or need? What should a church know about serving those in poverty?

These are just some of the questions that will be answered after church potluck on consecutive Sabbath afternoons in January starting January 8 and continuing January 15 and 22 from 1-3 PM. Christmas VBS



It looked like, smelled like, and seemed just like a night in a marketplace during the time when Jesus was born in Bethlehem.
