Working together provides needed items

For some time, Donna Schuster has promised an article about how she has been able to purchase many needed items for the church kitchen over the years. Here is what she wrote. —Ed.

In 1990 we needed a dishwasher for our new kitchen. At that time we were selling nuts along with our fruit program at our church school on Independence Road. Along with our nut program, we started our recycling program. The bulk of our monies for two years was from the nuts. During that time we purchased a dishwasher (still working), and a very expensive knife set (which we still have

and use). We also purchased the sound system for our fellowship hall which has been updated. The school needed some money, so out of our fund we gave them \$241.

Since 1992 our funding has come from pop cans only. Below is a list of our major purchases over the past 16 years.

1 Microwave

Extra Good Silverware (Plus when Betty Crocker was canceling out our pattern we purchased quite a bit of extra silverware at a rock bottom price. It's put away and will be used as needed.)

Electric Range (Sharon Santa Rita gave us \$100 from the Chair Fund. Recycle paid \$400.)

20 White Linen Polyester Tablecloths used for special occasions.

Replacement of Stacking Ovens (Our largest purchase—\$1201.49. We had two donations totaling \$320. Recycle paid \$881.49.) We have purchased quite a few minor and miscellaneous items throughout the years, such as a third cart for the kitchen, miscellaneous serving pieces, stool for the kitchen, storage units for our closet, picnic tablecloths (which have disappeared—would appreciate their return), card tables, can openers, drawer dividers, dishtowels, etc.

So many have been faithful bringing in pop cans. Some of our steady people throughout all of these years have been Jo Ann Arthur, Mary Snowberger, Will & Loni Orlet, Jerry & Marcene Marsa, Burge & Lu Bills, Eleanor Meade, Bill & Janell Ashley, Shirlie Heiney, Hermine Wright, Dave & Kimiko Kawakami, Fern Baer, Jim & Cindy Naus, plus a host of others when they had some on hand. My son, Kurt, has saved cans for us at his business since day one.

Our range top on our counter has seen better days, so we will be replacing it when we have enough money on hand. Saving pop cans all of these years has enabled us to keep our kitchen up and running. The more cans we have to recycle the more we can do for our kitchen, so we welcome pop cans from each and every one. I have heard that plastic bottles are being used more and more so one of these days we might not have the cans. Keep them coming while we have them!

Also, throughout the years quite a few of our members have donated items for our kitchen, plus a host of towels, hot pads, and miscellaneous items. We thank each and every one of you for helping to keep our kitchen in good shape. —Donna Schuster ##
