

What kind of praise is pleasing to God in the sanctuary?

Psalm 149:1-4 (NLT) says, "1 Praise the LORD! Sing to the LORD a new song. Sing his praises in the assembly of the faithful. 2 O Israel, rejoice in your Maker. O people of Jerusalem, exult in your King. 3 Praise his name with dancing, accompanied by tambourine and harp. 4 For the LORD delights in his people."

These verses say quite a bit. They tell us new songs about the LORD are pleasing to the LORD. They tell us that praising, singing, rejoicing, and yes, even dancing

But the world has hijacked God's praise.

So we at Toledo First are taking back

what rightly belongs to God.

accompanied by percussion instruments are pleasing to the LORD. They tell us the LORD delights when all his people participate in worship.

But the world has hijacked God's praise. So we at Toledo First are taking back what rightly belongs to God. Emerging generations of believers are helping us unlearn some sincere misunderstandings of worship. Like whether praise dancing should occur in the sanctuary. So let's reread Psalm 149:1 this time in the KJV. "149 Praise ye the Lord. Sing unto the Lord a new song, and his praise in the congregation of saints."

Isn't it interesting that both older and modern

Isn't it interesting that both older and modern translations recognize, in context, the reclamation of praising, singing, rejoicing and even dancing "in the congregation of the saints"?

translations recognize, in context, the reclamation of praising, singing, rejoicing and even dancing "in the congregation of the saints"? Psalm 68:24-25 adds, "24 Your procession has come into view, O God—the procession of my God and King as he goes into the sanctuary. 25 Singers are in front, musicians behind; between them are young women playing tambourines."

The question therefore, is not whether praise dancing in the sanctuary is pleasing to God. It clearly is. The question is where is the sanctuary with the congregation of the saints? In the Bible, the congregation of the saints gathered in the sanctuary courtyards. There was one for Gentiles. One a little closer for Jewish women. And one even closer for Jewish men. But only one man, from the tribe of Levi, could go into the most holy place. And that was the high priest. But even he could only go in there once a year.

If the sanctuary platform / podium area in the church today is the most holy place, logically then only the pastor should be standing there. And he should only be doing so once a year. But that is clearly a violation of common sense. Not to mention a violation of the priesthood of all believers (cf. Exodus 19:6; 1 Peter 2:9; Revelation 1:6). Which is one reason why pastor and elders enter the sanctuary from the east side floor hallway and sit in a pew instead of sitting in a chair up on the sanctuary platform / podium area. We are modeling the priesthood of all believers every single Sabbath!

Additionally, when Jesus died, the curtain to the most holy place was ripped in half from top to bottom (Matthew 27:50-51). The tearing of the veil at the

moment of Jesus' death dramatically symbolized that His sacrifice, the shedding of His own blood, was sufficient atonement for sin. But it also signified that now the way into the most holy place is open for all people, for all time, for all ages. Rightly understood, after Jesus died, the sanctuary with "the assembly of the faithful" and "the congregation of the saints" is anywhere where there are saints gathered to worship God. Jesus said in Matthew 18:20, "For where two or three gather together as my followers, I am there among them."

Still, some folks compare the platform / podium area in the church today to the most holy place. But that is like comparing apples with oranges. Because the people never entered the holy or most holy place. You cannot compare

our present day church service to the holy or most holy. The people were only allowed in the outer courts and that is where they would gather. That is where "the assembly of the faithful" and "the congregation of the saints" would be praising, singing, rejoicing and even dancing. As Jesus Himself was apparently pleased to witness.

Some Adventists are surprised to read the following in Desire of Ages p.463 paragraph 2: "When He spoke these words, Jesus was in the court of the temple specially connected with the services of the Feast of Tabernacles. In the center of this court rose two lofty standards, supporting lamp stands of great size. After the evening sacrifice, all the lamps were kindled, shedding their light over Jerusalem. This ceremony was in commemoration of the pillar of light that guided Israel in the desert, and was also regarded as pointing to the coming of the Messiah. At evening when the lamps were lighted, the court was a scene of great rejoicing. Gray-haired men, the priests of the temple and the rulers of the people, united in the festive dances to the sound of instrumental music and the chants of the Levites."

So we're grateful our newest church members, Karen and Courtney Simpson, like Cassidy Cross before them, are interested in praising, singing, rejoicing and even praise dancing "in the assembly of the faithful" and "congregation of saints". They're working together to provide meaningful praise dances for worship in 2017. Karen says, "There is power in movement. Movement has power to stir the senses and emotions, and convey a message that cannot always be expressed through words or song alone."

The selected name of their praise dance group is N'Couraged. They practice on Sundays at 2pm. Their mission is to give praise and worship to the Lord through beautiful, graceful and flowing dance movement. All girls between the ages of 10-18 are welcome to participate. But all ages in "the assembly of the faithful" and "the congregation of the saints" will be inspired. —Pastor Mike Fortune ##
